Position Summary

The College of Natural Resources, Environmental Science Program at the University of Idaho, Moscow, ID, seeks two (2) full-time postdoctoral research associates to play critical roles in enhancing a research program related to the human dimensions of long-term agro-ecosystems assessment. One position will emphasize grazing land production systems and the other will emphasize crop production systems. Context of each position will link to a national network of sites within the Long-term Agro-ecological Research (LTAR) Network. The initial appointments are for one year; annual renewals for up to two additional years are contingent on satisfactory performance and/or availability of funding.

In addition, the successful candidate will work closely with the project PI and investigators to guide and support the project team and fulfill administrative duties (preparation of reports, budget management, etc.). The successful candidate will also be expected to work with the project team to identify and pursue additional funding opportunities to support human dimensions of LTAR efforts.
